In honor of our partnership with the Dunbar Pavilion on the Dunbar Wellness Project, we selected the theme of *Just* Nourishment to guide our annual programming.


CRFS News

Assistant Professor (Indigenous scholar) in Land and Food Systems

The Faculty of Land and Food Systems at the University of British Columbia, Vancouver, Canada (www.landfood.ubc.ca) is seeking an outstanding Indigenous candidate for a full-time position at the rank of Assistant Professor (tenure track) within either the Faculty's Applied Biology Program or Food, Nutrition and Health Program. The anticipated start date is July 1, 2021.

Applicants must have a PhD and postdoctoral or equivalent experience. Candidates must demonstrate:

- potential for outstanding research in an area that builds upon the Faculty's
 existing research strengths within a relevant field such as, but not limited to
 animal biology, animal welfare, dietetics, food and resource economics, food
 science, food security, food sovereignty, nutritional science, plant science, soil
 science or sustainable agriculture; this may include scholarly approaches to
 the intersection of food systems and Indigenous issues.
- potential for excellence in teaching at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, the ability to complement the current teaching programs, and capacity to mentor MSc and PhD students
- evidence of working with researchers from diverse disciplines and ability to effectively communicate their work to a broader public.

The Faculty of Land and Food Systems (LFS) is a world leader in integrated research, education, and service to address critical global issues around human health and a sustainable food supply. In alignment with the UBC Indigenous Strategic Plan, LFS seeks to expand its capacity to participate in collaborative and equal partnerships with Indigenous communities through teaching, research and service.
